New South Court Tower

A ribbon-cutting ceremony will be held for the newly-constructed South Court Tower (formerly referred to as the Criminal Tower) at 3 p.m. on February 14 – Arizona's centennial day of statehood. The Clerk of the Court's Office is transitioning several services to the South Court Tower. **Effective February 21, 2012**, the Clerk of the Court's Criminal Exhibits, Grand Jury Services, and the Regional Court Center and Early Disposition Courts (RCC/EDC) processing will relocate to the 4th Floor of the South Court Tower, located at 175 West Madison Street in downtown Phoenix. Probate Operations

The Clerk of the Court's offices located in the Central and West Court buildings in downtown Phoenix will be remodeled throughout 2012. The remodel will include consolidating the Family and Civil File Counters into one location. This will not impact Probate Court operations. Probate courtrooms and file counters will remain at the Old Courthouse, 125 W. Washington, in downtown Phoenix, across from the Central Court Building.

Centennial Events

If you are interested, tours of the new South Court Tower will be conducted after the formal dedication ceremony, which begins at 3 p.m. on Tuesday, February 14, 2012. Comments at the dedication ceremony will be made by retired United States Supreme Court Justice Sandra Day O'Connor and other judicial dignitaries and county officials. The dedication ceremony will take place on the steps of the South Court Tower at the intersection of First Avenue and Madison Street in Downtown Phoenix.

At 4:00 p.m., the Arizona Clerks of the Superior Court and the Arizona Supreme Court will host the Centennial Marriage Event. There will be up to 100 couples who will be getting married on the ceremonial steps of the Arizona Courts Building, facing Wesley Bolin Plaza and the State Capitol. Couples from Pima, La Paz, Mohave and Maricopa Counties have reserved spots for the event.
